In Moana 2, Moana sets off on an ambitious mission which becomes more crucial to complete than ever once she gets disturbing news about what might happen if she does not succeed in her task. With a small crew consisting of a historian, a craftswoman, a farmer and some familiar faces including a pig and rooster and eventually Maui, she must learn to lead a team and save her island.



I rate Moana 2 3.5 stars It's a good movie for the whole family, with suspense and action whilst celebrating Polynesian culture.



Here at Tween Holiday we're back with another recipe.

This time it's gingerbread cookies!

Ingredients:

125g unsalted butter

150g brown suagr

125g honey

1 large egg

400g all purpose flour

1/2 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. baking soda

1 tbsp. ground ginger

Spices of your choice

Recipe:

- 1. Mix together sugar, honey, egg and butter in a large bowl. You can use an electric hand mixer or a stand mixer to do this.
- 2. In a separate bowl sift together dry ingredients and then fold into wet ingredients
- 3. Transfer the dough onto a lightly floured piece of baking paper and roll into a rectangle
- 4. Place another piece of baking paper on top and put in the fridge to chill for over an hour
- 5. Once finished removed from fridge and prepare baking tray lined with baking paper and preheat the oven to 180°
- 6. Using cookie cutter cut out your shapes and place on top of already prepared baking tray. Then put in the oven to cook for 10-15 minutes. Once finished baking allow to cool and enjoy.






Movies to watch this season

Equipment:


- Paintbrushes of different sizes and thicknesses
- Plain ornament
- Coloured paints of your choice
- Sturdy cardboard and ribbon (optional)

Use your paintbrushes and your creativity to create different designs on your plain Christmas ornaments. The designs can be basic and simple or if you're feeling a bit more artistic you can make them more detailed and complex.



You can also make DIY Christmas ornaments from scratch using firm cardboard and ribbon. Cut the cardboard into any desired shape and then start to decorate using your paints. Once the design is finished and the paint has dried, poke a hole into the ornament using a sharp pencil and thread the ribbon into the hole, ready to be hung on your Christmas tree.
